Shot during the fateful six months between September 11, 2001, and March 11, 2002, the film is an examination of the possibilities of reconciliation. During these six months, I travelled widely in South Africa, Honduras and the USA, and everywhere I went, I found myself surrounded by people who knew about suffering. I met and filmed a wide range of people, including jailed convicts, the poor of townships, orphaned children in waste dumps as well as human rights activists. And all of them provided me with an insight into the long and hard road to reconciliation in the world.
